Our renovation project includes new and renovated classroom training space, a renovated welcome area, additional legal services space to ensure client confidentiality, and an overhaul of our public restrooms. COMMUNITY GARDEN


On August 5th, NSC held the opening meeting for our newest project, Growing Together Gardens. The new gardens, located on 3 acres of land in Point Breeze, currently has 150 raised beds built for growers and is now opened to gardeners from the Karen, Chin, Burmese, Bhutanese, Congolese communities and their neighbors. We are scaling up our capacity and plan to have a total of 500 raised beds by April 2016. In conjunction with this program, we are also launching a new entrepreneurial training program, partnering with the Pennsylvania Horticultural Society and funding from the USDA to support a group of refugee women in starting a farmers market in Point Breeze. Planting for fall crops began on Sunday
